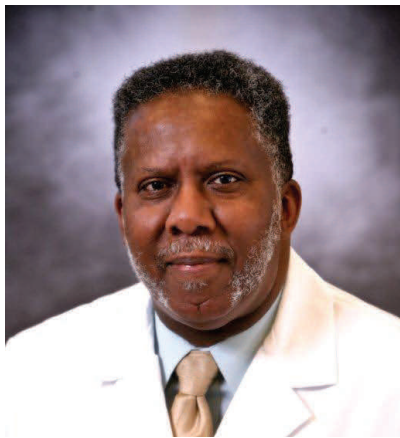

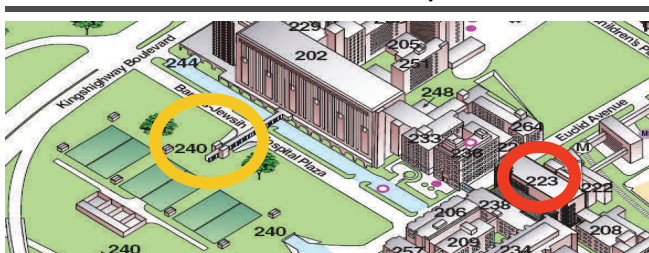

About the Lecturer

Patrick Griffith is Professor of Clinical Medicine and Chief of the Division of Neurology, Department of Internal Medicine at Morehouse School of Medicine in Atlanta, Georgia.. He served as Professor of Neurology and Medical Director of the Clinical Research Center at Meharry Medical College in Nashville, Tennessee until September 2008. Dr. Griffith has been a Visiting Professor of Neurologic Education at Mayo Medical School, Rochester, MN and a Visiting Professor of Neuroscience and Physiology at Saint George’s University of Medicine, Grenada West Indies.

His research interest and practice focuses on the diagnosis, management and treatment of Vascular Dementia, Alzheimer’s Disease, Parkinson’s Disease Dementia, and HIV-associated Dementia. He has served as President of the National Medical Association affiliates for Atlanta Medical Association and Georgia State Medical Association. Dr. Griffith was the lead author for the research study “Open-label trial of Donepezil in African Americans with mild to moderate Alzheimer’s Disease” J. National Medical Association 2006;98:1590-1597.

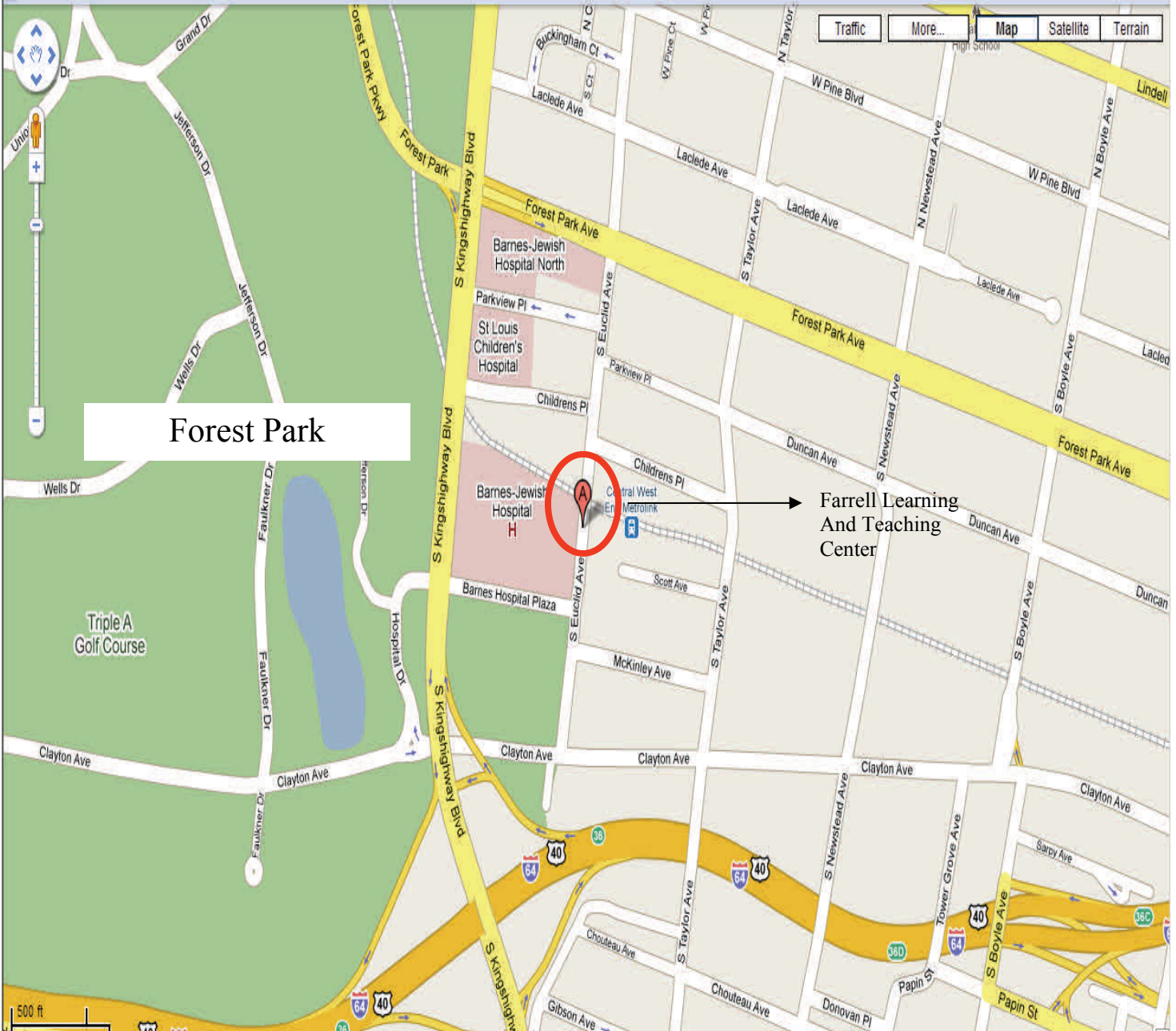
